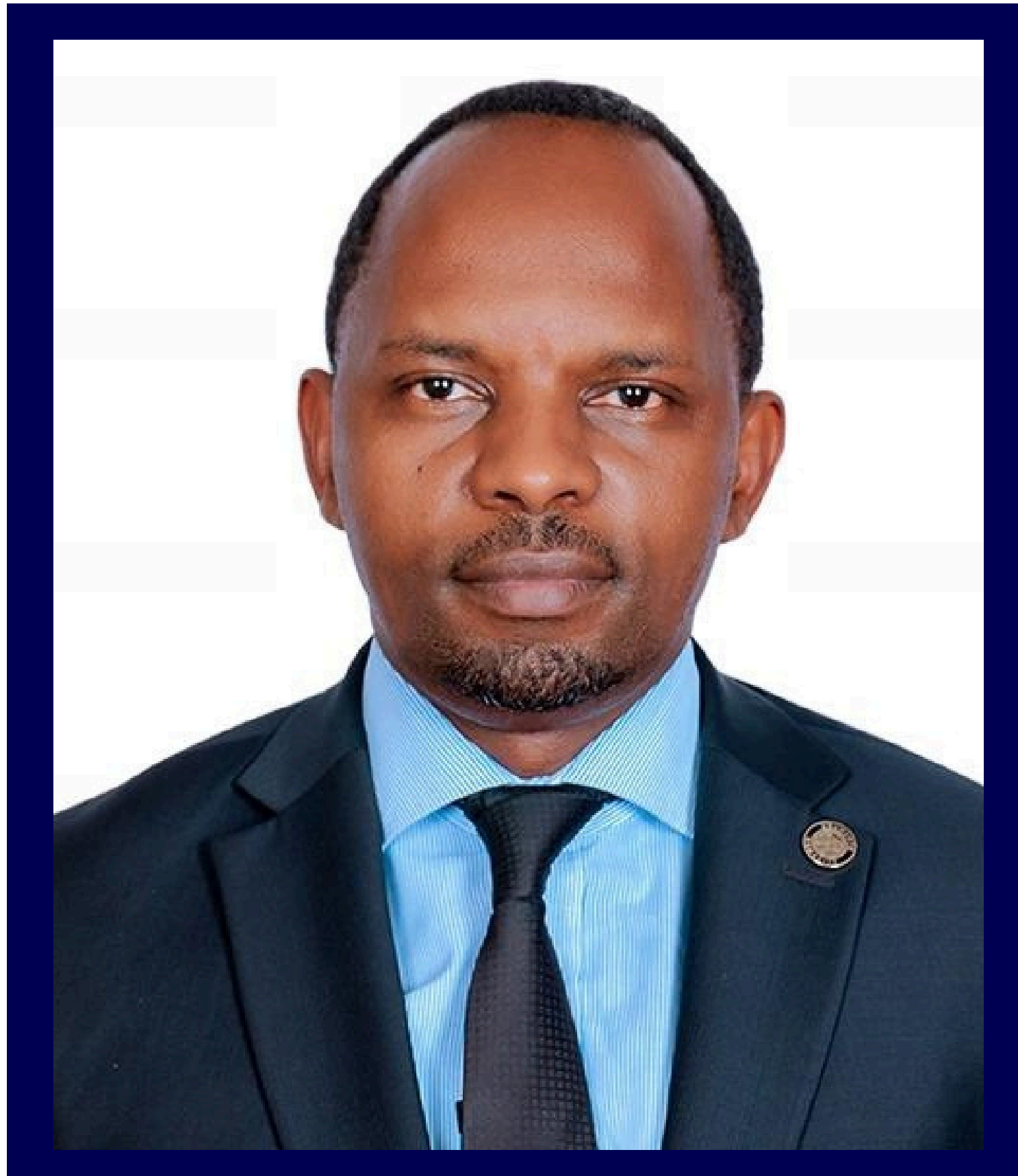

Since its inaugural establishment in 2008,
ILPD is organizing the graduation for the
Diploma in Legal Practice for the 13th time.

527 graduands will receive their degrees today. 496 among them have completed the program leading to the Diploma in Legal Practice and they are from eight (8) different nationalities, namely Cameroon, Chad, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Nigeria, Rwanda and South Sudan. 31 graduands, all holding different leadership positions in Rwanda and from different educational backgrounds have completed the Diploma in Child Justice.

Today's graduation is therefore unprecedented for two more reasons: it is the first time the Institute is graduating its first cohort in the Diploma of Child Justice. It is also the first time the Institute graduates some of its DLP students in the same academic year, a trend that we commit to maintain.

It is therefore a great honor and privilege to have all of you here in support of ILPD and our graduands. I would like to emphasize that we don't take your support for granted and before we proceed further, we would like to give a special recognition to all our leaders who are here with us today. Your unreserved support strengthens further our dedication to the mandate of the Institute.

The Institute will never thank you enough for your invaluable contribution to the building of the Cameroon, the Chad, the Gabon, the Gambia, the Ghana, the Nigeria, the Rwanda, the South Sudan and finally the Africa we want.

On behalf the Institute, I would like also to recognize key partners who have been with ILPD in this journey. The University of Rwanda and the INES have offered unconditional home to our students in Kigali and Musanze. UNICEF-Rwanda has supported the first and the second cohort in the Diploma in Child Justice, totaling sixty-four (64) students towards the end of this academic year.

Last year, Abayo & Co Advocates awarded our best performer, this year this prestigious law firm has also continued supporting our best performer.

Three new and impactful non-governmental organizations, namely Legal Aid Forum, InterPeace Rwanda and Initiatives for Peace and Human Rights (iPeace) have also joined the long list of our prestigious partners in awarding our best performers from different intakes. These three NGOs are already in a strategic partnership with ILPD through MoUs that enable us to build capacity in different areas of human rights. Ladies and gentlemen, all protocols observed

The Diploma in Child Justice is one of the outputs of the JRLOS strategy for universal access to justice. Justice Sector has vowed for a justice system that is universally affordable, accessible, friendly and effective. We will never emphasize enough that justice is the greatest concern of man on earth and that it remains the ligament that is holding together civilized beings as well as civilized nations. The more we increase our undersatanding of the concept of justice the more we increase the number of reasonable people with very sensitive conscience in our respective communities.

For Children, it has been established that retributive justice is not always the right remedy. The restorative approach to justice rather facilitates rehabilitation and integration, two key strategies in justice for children. The National Child Policy recommends a participatory approach in handling child matters. It is this same policy that called for the training of critical mass for a child friendly justice system in Rwanda.



The Diploma in Child Justice is a multidisciplinary certificate that has equipped trainees with tailored knowledge and skills in child psychology, child victimology, social development, social justice, social media and online child protection, juvenile justice, child rights and family law as well as child protection under international human rights law.

Child Justice Graduands have now basic skills to professionally handle child related issues regardless of the speciality of their respective Institutions. Judges who undertook this program understand now child psychology as an additional skill to what they had, NCDA Child Protection Officers understand now child justice issues and investigators as well as prosecutors understand that retribution is an exception for child criminal justice.

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ILPD and its stakeholders in this program especially NCDA and UNICEF would wish to have this program included in the budget of institutions dealing with children.



For instance, all court registrars, judges, advocates, investigators, prosecutors and child protection officers who are dealing with matters related to children should be certified. Mandatory certification will not only raise the quality of justice for children but it will also help us measure the impact of this program on the Rwandan society.

In addition to this, ILPD would wish to see this program benefiting other African Nations which are yet to frame or to implement child justice policies. We need however the assistance of all stakeholders, especially UNICEF, NCDA and NHRC to assist in disseminating this program beyond Rwanda. The Institute is ready to tailor a short course program to an international audience, to launch a full-time mode and to translate the program in French if it can get a full class of Francophone students and to adopt a hybrid teaching methodology.

Dear Graduands;

All of you who have completed your DLP are ready for any legal profession in your respective countries. Last year we emphasized the need for honesty for our graduands to become successful lawyers and leaders. We also insisted on the role of law as a catalyser of social peace, cohesion and harmony, a rare commodity in systems solely built on litigation. In Africa, we know that justice is not built on the binary choice of yes and no, legal or illegal. Between the two there is a whole world.

We should always remember that justice is an element of governance. As President Paul Kagame puts it: "Where governance is compromised, it is like having a weak immune system, which is vulnerable to all kinds of opportunistic infections or attacks. There is no way to build sustainable peace and security, both within and between our continents, without putting governance at the centre."

The falling of governance does not come as Rome did through the invasion of barbarians. It falls slowly. Any case of injustice is like a light that was guiding us go out fading little by little. This happens when we lose sight of basic principles.

Finally, don't forget that the more you gain in experience and in judgement, the more you become a good lawyer. Mastering rules is one thing, discovering the common sense that work properly is another thing. Judgment is to law what water is to crops said Philip K. Howard in his book *The Death of Common Sense: How Law is suffocating America*. Principles should allow us to think and reach a judgement that fits the situation. Law by itself cannot think. That is why it is entrusted to humans in order for them to take responsibility for its interpretation. This is part of what you have studied in Common Law Practice and you have to put it into practice for delivering quality and timely justice in whatever capacity you will be holding.

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Please allow to conclude on a specific note for ILPD. The Institute is happy to announce that its reviewed DLP program has already been internally approved. This program will be submitted to external stakeholders and to the High Education Council in this December 2024. It is expected to be implemented from July 2025 in English and in French. **Honorable Ministers,**

Distinguished leaders,

Dear alumni and dear Parents,

We need your support for this revised DLP program. We also hope that issues that are obstructing ILPD's efforts to enforce educational integration in Africa and that have resulted in the drastic reduction of our students from Cameroon, Ghana, Kenya and Uganda will have been addressed. ILPD belongs to the Justice Sector. That is the reason why we call to all leaders in the Sector to support its mission including the one of raising the flag of Rwanda on the entire continent.



We commit to become a regional centre of legal excellence by increasing our students from 732 per year today to 1,200 per year in 2029. We wish also to move from 1,100 persons beneficiary of short courses per year to 1,850 persons per year in 2029. We plan to strengthen our research capacity in order to empower our strategic leadership. This will require regular issues of the *Rwanda Law Journal and establishing the Rwanda Law Academy*.

In addition to this, the Institute is planning to expand its infrastructure by establishing smart classrooms, launching online programs starting with short courses, acquiring a conference facility and sports grounds for our Nyanza Campus and getting a modern Institute's complex in Kigali. The Institute plans also to upgrade its Management Information System. All these will require strengthening our financial and human capacity as well as having strategic partnerships with sister institutions, universities with international reputation and development partners. For this strategic plan to materialize we need your full support.

The achievement that are outlined in the ILPD's Performance Report 2023/2024 as well as today's graduation are the results of your support and the dedication of all the staff. I wish to thank each ILPD's staff from the two Vice-Rectors to the lowest employee at the gate or in the kitchen. Each one's efforts constitute the molecule of the success we are celebrating today and we will be celebrating tomorrow. Together we can still achieve more. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year 2025.

Today, LAF is the leading non-state legal aid provider in Rwanda, comprising 38 national and international NGOs, professional bodies, university legal aid clinics, and faith-based initiatives.

LAF is committed to empowering the Rwandan population, particularly indigent and vulnerable individuals, to utilize the law, formal and informal justice mechanisms, and dispute resolution processes to assert their rights and advance their interests. Legal empowerment promotes individuals' awareness of justice issues and collective legal action to address structural injustices and transform systems that exclude and discriminate against vulnerable groups.

LAF's work has led to significant achievements, including heightened attention to access to justice for the poor in Rwanda, notable policy changes, positive legislation favoring legal aid, expanded legal aid services, greater rights awareness and outreach, and stronger collaboration among legal aid service providers.

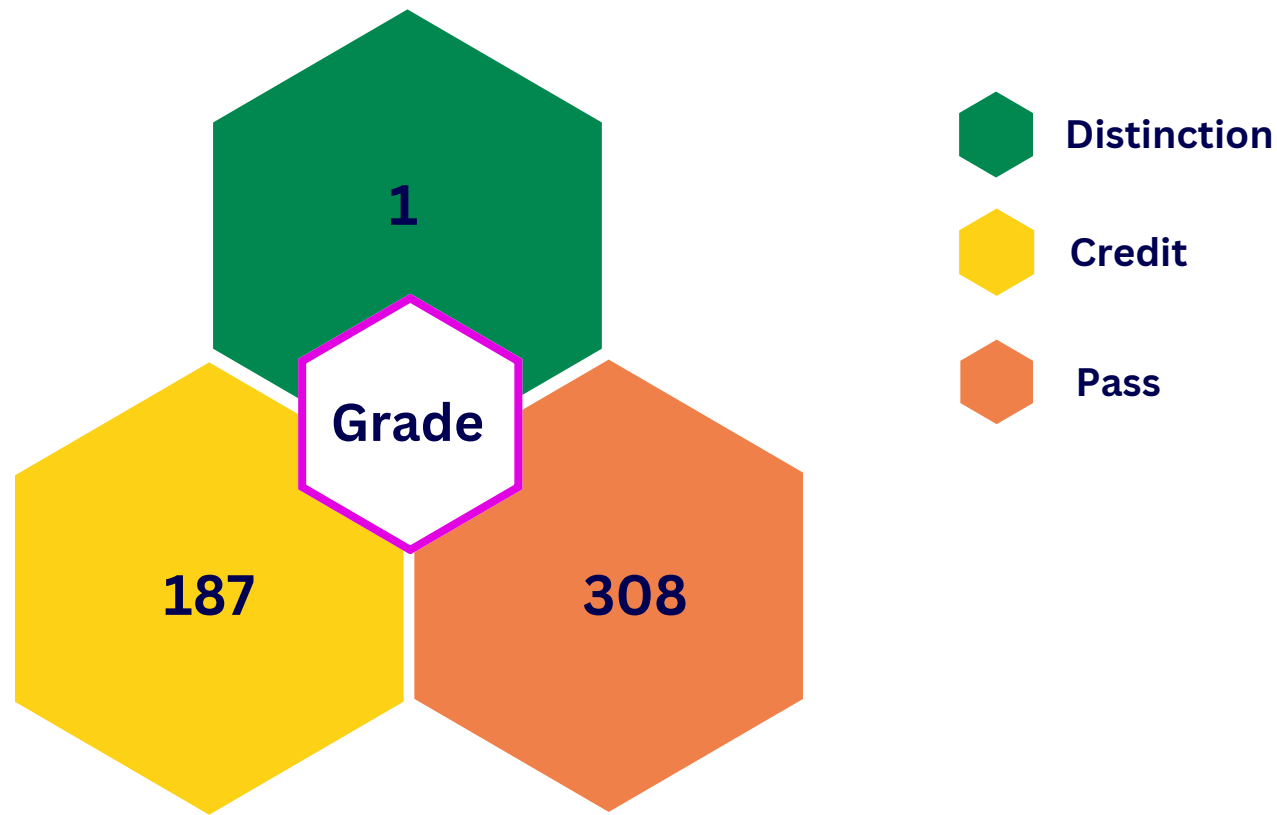

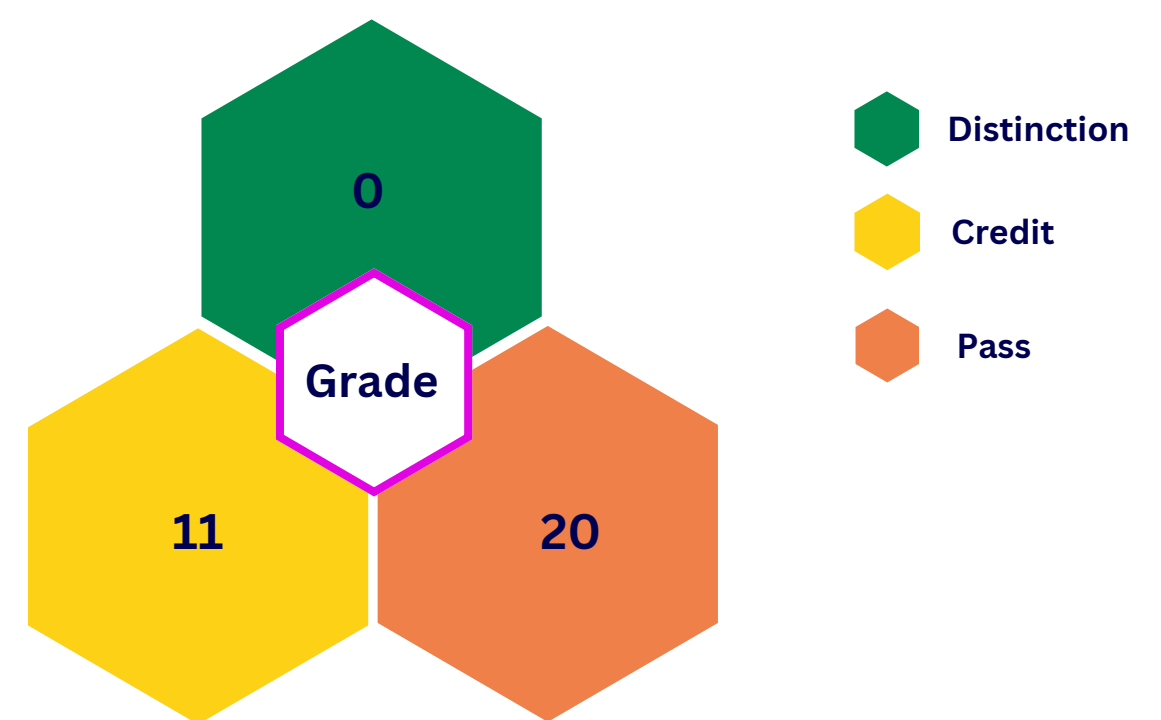
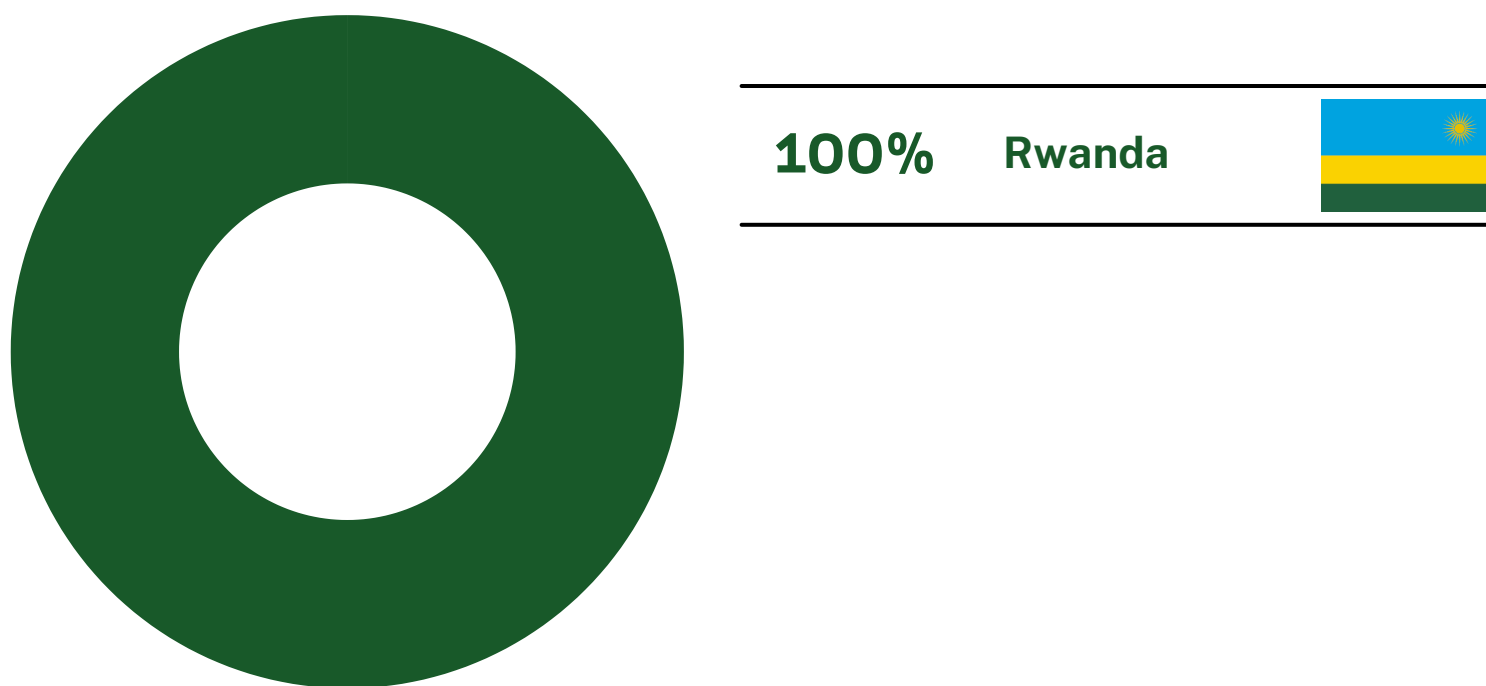

DIPLOMA IN CHILD JUSTICE

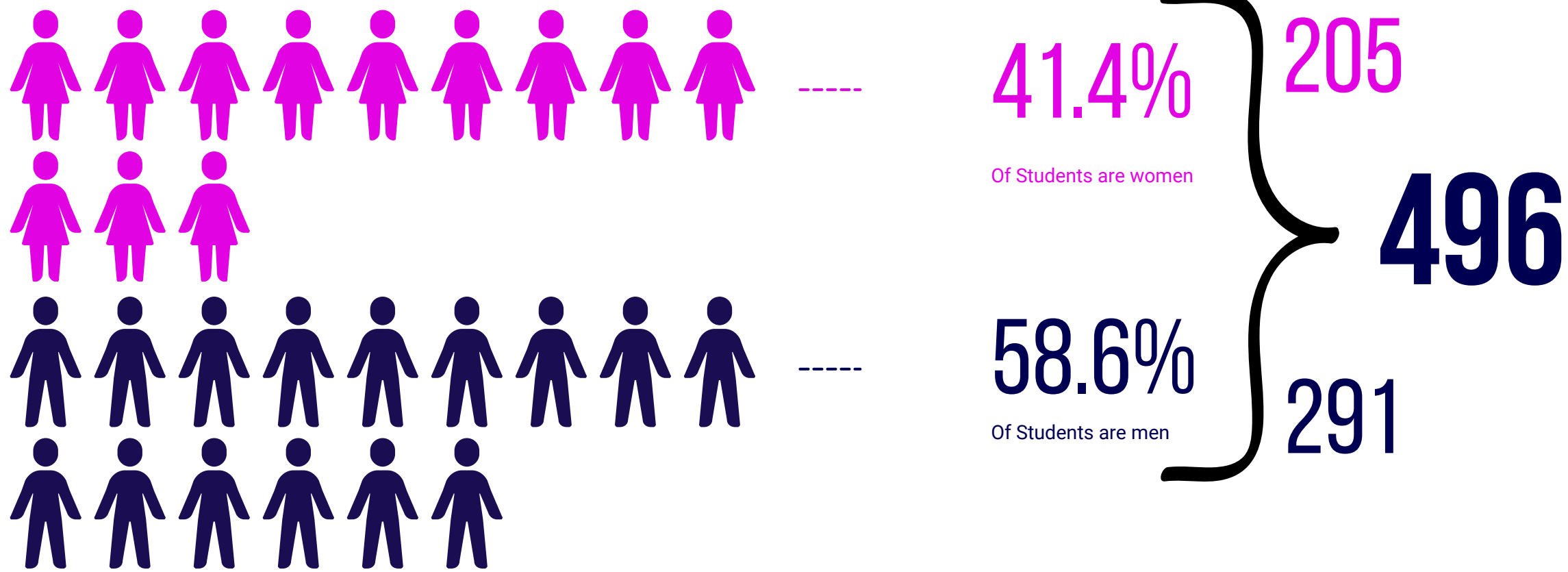

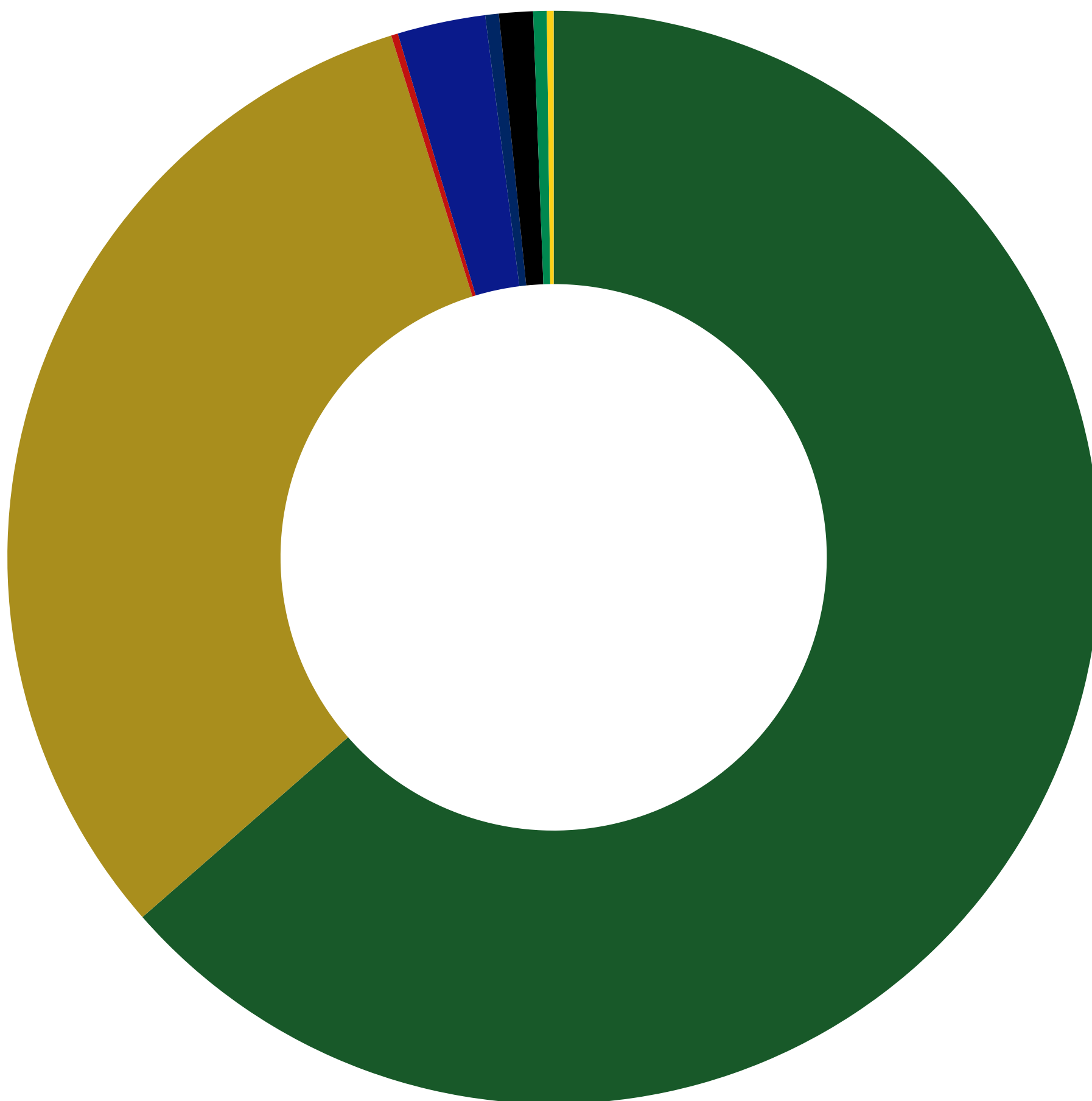

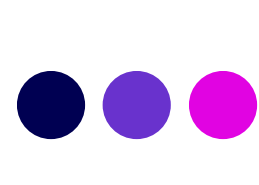
