Good morning.

It is a great honour and a true
pleasure for me to join you today at
the 14th Graduation Ceremony of the
Institute of Legal Practice and
Development mostly known as 'ILPD'.

At the outset, allow me to extend my
sincere congratulations to all the
graduates receiving Postgraduate
Diplomas in Legal Practice, Child
Justice, and Tax Investigation. This
achievement reflects not only the
successful completion of your
studies, but also your readiness to
take on responsibility within the legal
profession.

I also wish to commend the ILPD for
its continued commitment to
excellence in legal training and for its
important role in strengthening the
justice sector in Rwanda and beyond.



The programmes you have completed reflect key areas of national and professional importance. On one hand, legal Practice equips you with the practical skills necessary to uphold due process and ensure the effective delivery of justice. Child Justice highlights the need for specialized, rights-based approaches that safeguard the well-being and best interests of children within the justice system. Tax Investigation, on the other hand, responds to the growing complexity of economic systems, strengthening accountability, combating financial crimes, and contributing to the protection of public resources. Together, these areas illustrate the evolving role of the legal profession in addressing both social and economic priorities.

Dear Graduates,

You graduate at a time when the global legal landscape is increasingly complex. Across different contexts, the application of law continues to be tested,

reminding us that its strength lies not only in its existence, but in its consistent and principled application. In this regard, international law remains an essential framework for cooperation and order, whose credibility depends on fairness, consistency, and integrity in its implementation.

The balance between State sovereignty and the protection of human dignity remains a central consideration in the development of legal systems. These principles are not mutually exclusive; rather, they must be understood as complementary foundations of a just and stable legal order. Experience has shown that strong legal systems are those that are both respectful of institutional frameworks and responsive to the protection of fundamental rights.

In this evolving context, accountability continues to play a critical role in maintaining confidence in legal institutions. Consistent and impartial application



of legal principles reinforces trust, while gaps in accountability risk weakening it. At the same time, emerging challenges—including technological developments and transnational issues—require legal frameworks that are adaptable and forward-looking. This calls for legal practitioners who combine technical competence with sound judgment, independence, and integrity.

**Dear Graduates,
Distinguished Guests,**

The interaction between law and technology is becoming increasingly central to modern legal practice. Technological advancements are transforming how legal services are delivered, how evidence is generated and assessed, and how justice institutions operate. At the same time, they introduce new risks and regulatory challenges. As graduands, you are entering a profession that requires not only a solid understanding of the law,

but also the ability to adapt to innovation, engage with emerging issues, and contribute to shaping legal frameworks that remain relevant and effective in a rapidly evolving environment.

This need for adaptability is equally reflected at the national level. Rwanda continues to strengthen its justice sector through forward-looking policies and reforms. The Rwanda Criminal Justice Policy provides a coherent framework aimed at enhancing fairness, efficiency, and coordination across justice institutions, while promoting approaches that go beyond purely punitive measures. The continued development of Alternative Dispute Resolution mechanisms further reflects a commitment to accessible and timely justice. Your role, as you enter the profession, will be to give practical effect to these frameworks by ensuring that justice is delivered in a manner that is both responsive and inclusive.



In a broader sense, these efforts are closely linked to economic development. A predictable and well-functioning legal system creates the conditions necessary for investment, entrepreneurship, and job creation. By ensuring legal certainty and supporting fair economic practices, the law contributes directly to national growth and stability. This connection is not theoretical—it is clearly demonstrated across different jurisdictions.

For example, in the United States, legal services generated approximately USD 387.7 billion in value added in 2024, representing about 1.3% of GDP[1], while in the United Kingdom, the sector contributed over £37 billion, accounting for roughly 1.6% of total economic output[2], and generating a £7.6 billion trade surplus.[3] These figures illustrate that legal services are not merely supportive functions, but form part of the productive core of modern economies.

Beyond this direct contribution, legal frameworks also shape economic activity by facilitating business formation, investment, and market confidence.

The contribution of the legal profession to employment is equally significant. In the United States, the legal services sector employs approximately 1.2 million people[4], with over 860,000 lawyers across the economy, while in the United Kingdom, the sector supports more than 300,000 direct jobs[5], and over half a million jobs when indirect effects are taken into account. Importantly, this impact extends beyond the legal profession itself. Evidence shows that every 100 jobs in legal services can support approximately 167 jobs across the wider economy, reflecting strong linkages with other sectors.

In our context, however, the measurement of this contribution remains less developed. In Rwanda, official national accounts capture legal services within the broader category of professional, scientific and technical activities, which generated approximately 368 billion Rwf in value added.[6] Labour force data further indicate that employment in this category represents about 0.8 percent of total employment, with a significant share in informal arrangements—highlighting both the growth of professional services and the need for greater formalization.[7]

Across the region, similar patterns emerge. Countries such as Kenya and South Africa report significantly larger numbers of legal practitioners, reflecting the scale of employment and the expanding role of legal services in supporting business, regulatory compliance, and economic activity. Yet, despite this evident contribution,

comprehensive and disaggregated data on legal services remain limited across many African countries.

This calls for a more deliberate and sustained effort—not only to strengthen the legal profession, but also to better measure and articulate its contribution to economic growth and employment.

For you as graduates, these realities carry an important implication. Your role will not be limited to the application of legal knowledge. Through your work—whether in advisory services, dispute resolution, public service, or private practice—you will contribute to creating an environment that supports enterprise, enables employment, and sustains economic development. In doing so, you will be contributing not only to the legal profession, but to the broader functioning and progress of society.

And where challenges seem complex, there is a need for clarity, integrity, and commitment.

Ultimately, the impact of your career will not be defined solely by the positions you hold, but by the principles you uphold.

In conclusion, allow me once again to congratulate all the graduates on this important achievement. I also wish to recognize and commend specifically partner institutions such as the UNICEF and Rwanda Revenue Authority for sponsoring some of the programs, the University of Rwanda and Ines Ruhengeli for their facilitation in hosting classes, sponsors of the Alumni Association and of the best performers, the families, ILPD staff, and in general the Institute, for the support, guidance, and dedication that have made this accomplishment possible.

Today, we are celebrating two events:
the inaugural launch of the ILPD's
Alumni Network and the graduation of
393 students in Legal Practice, 26
students in Child Justice and 18
students in Tax Investigation.

For the Tax Investigation, it is the
inaugural graduation as well. Those
graduating today are automatically
ILPD'S Alumni. However, for you to
play an active role in the Alumni
Network, everyone will have to
express her or his informed consent to
join the Association.

Establishing the Alumni Network as a
club of justice brotherhood and one of
ILPD's Advisory Board is part of the
Institute's Strategic Goals for 2024-
2029. A strong Alumni Network,
alongside a robust ICT capacity and
education infrastructures in Nyanza
and Kigali is what will transform ILPD
into a leading institution in legal
practice.

Our strategies for transformation are built on four key main objectives:

- ▶ Enhancing legal professional capacity by modernising our programs,
- ▶ Transforming ILPD into a knowledge hub by strengthening the research policy,
- ▶ Creating a Learner-centered and technology-driven environment that meets diverse legal professional needs,
- ▶ Ensure institutional sustainability and innovation.

The newly approved Diploma in Legal Practice (DLP) and initiatives such as Certificates in Corporate Governance, Certificates in Refugee and Asylum Law, Certificates in Law for Non-Lawyers, Certificates in Mediation to name but a few are part of the first strategy. Moreover, the Institute has also embarked on strengthening its research policies.

On 13th February, ILPD launched the Special Issue on Transitional Justice of the Rwanda Law Journal. The Journal is now in the repository of the African Journal Online as we are negotiating to index it with Web of Science and Scopus. We believe that towards the end of this year, we will have secured these two indexations. Indexing an academic journal gives to it higher visibility, credibility and impact as it ensures that the publications are easily and quickly discoverable.

The Journal has also been published by a renowned publisher, LawAfrica. LawAfrica is a Kenya-based legal publishing house that is ranked the third legal publishing house in Africa after Lexis Nexis and Juta & Company from South Africa. Publishing the journal validates research through rigorous peer review and it establishes credibility and authority in the field. However, publishing outside Rwanda is very expensive. Materials that are published outside are not easily accessible, available or affordable.



That is the reason why the Institute, in partnership with its stakeholders, intends to open a local legal publishing academy.

The Rwanda Law Journal has the potential of contributing to the global scientific record. We therefore call on all graduates, alumni and legal researchers to consider that writing and reading improves the critical thinking that is becoming scarce on the menu of the educated people. Nowadays, **“We are living in a period of political anti-intellectualism...”** to recall one of the Headlines of The Guardian of Sunday 22nd March 2026 by Jess Cartner Morley.

Expertise is being dismissed as elitism, procedure as dull, facts as irrelevant. Anti-intellectualism has always been foundational to authoritarianism, depriving the people of the framework with which to question unfairness. With TikTok, YouTube, WhatsApp, Facebook, Instagram, Podcasts and Reddit, “... Everywhere, we are being dumbed down for profit by an addictive social media,

which turns us all into remote-working battery chickens of the attention farms of Silicon Valley. We feel powerless in the face of this, and our acceptance of it is insidious: in the modern phrase, “It’s not that deep”, and in the casual they’re-all-as-bad-as-each-other disengagement that is undermining democracy” and the rule of law reminds Jess Cartner Morley.

The Gen Z should not blindly co-opt the visually focused lifestyle content without digging deeper. Even Kim Kardashian at certain point found that she had to support her commercial career by experimenting what intellectual seriousness could be in taking the Bar Course. She probably took it very lightly and forgot to consider that lawyers’ intellectual ability is heavily focused on reading, precise writing and meticulous research.

Although Professor Max Raskin from New York University took her defense in the columns of The Washington Post of 3 *December 2025*,



alleging that abusing Artificial Intelligence should not have led to put Kim Kardashian on the same list as Kamala Harris and Jerry Brown, other celebrities who failed the bar exam, he admits that lawyers who surrender their critical thinking to Artificial Intelligence and don't check hallucinated citations run the risks of embarrassment before a serious judge.

Writing and reading will nurture your skills to scrutinize, to evaluate and to synthesize information and they will empower you to construct well-supported arguments and informed conclusions. This Journal is therefore yours. Let it live, shine and impact the legal development in our respective countries.

Dear Graduands,

Graduation means that the Institute is guaranteeing, until proven otherwise, that you are brilliant women and men who understand that justice is the greatest concern of man on earth and that it is the ligament that is holding together people of reason. The value of justice has become so expensive these days that we don't get it in every ordinary man regardless of his or her wealth or education.



More than ever, we have come to witness that in some instances, justice can be equated to strength, wealth and power. But that is tyranny. It is not justice. The idea of justice is simple. It is giving each person his due. For you, you are beyond the ordinary man. Your actions as well as omissions must always be legally correct and fair. It is not enough to have them legally correct. It is equally important to look at the consequences of your decisions.

Remember this wisdom from Honorable Zhou Qiang, former Chief Justice of China: “Fairness breeds justice, honesty breeds authority.” As you are entering your respective legal career, you will need authority and credibility. They are the two sides of a coin called integrity. Please remember that interest seeking, corruption or violations of laws by legal professionals are not matters just concerning the wrongdoers, they also undermine justice institutions and their sanctity.

We cannot expect a fair and impartial judicial process if courts, the bar or the prosecution are corrupted.

Citizens must feel and see that justice is served in every case. We must therefore improve our working approach and practice. Good and timely service is key for overcoming barriers to justice. It is important that in all instances we adopt a law-based governance approach.

Today we are blessed by the presence of Honorable Professor Sam Rugege, the Emeritus Chief Justice and Chairperson of the National Advisory Board on ADR in Rwanda. He has generously accepted to sacrifice his retirement rest and address this gathering on a crucial subject: *The Perspective of ADR in Africa*. On each graduation, the Institute is planning to have such a graduation speech from the highest legal authority.



As Africans we understand the relevance of resolving disputes through dialogue rather than confrontation and exacerbation of the initial antagonism. The primary mission of justice should be to maintain social stability.

Modern lawyers are called to keep a careful balance between maintaining social stability and safeguarding individual's legitimate rights and interests. Social fairness and justice have to be our core values.

We would like to recall that ILPD does not currently depend on the national recurrent budget, as it has, since 2017, fully financed its operational expenditures through internally generated revenues derived from professional training, Continuing Legal Education, consultancy, and related services. This model significantly reduces

the fiscal burden on Government and demonstrates ILPD's strong financial discipline and institutional viability.

For ILPD, we believe that the priority role of public financing, particularly through the Ministry of Finance and Economic Planning should be to support strategic development and infrastructure investments that would unlock the Institute's full revenue-generating potential. Reinstating and scaling development budget allocations and integrating priority projects into the Medium-Term Expenditure Framework would enable the implementation of high-impact capital projects that are beyond the reach of internally generated funds alone, while yielding long-term returns on public investment. These include but are not limited to an amphitheater, sports gymnasium and hostels in Nyanza and a continuous legal education facility in Kigali to start with.



However, for the last five years our pleas for the funding of such projects have remained without positive response. Sometimes we have the feeling that financial technicians don't fully capture the economic potentials that are offered by the Royal City of Nyanza.

Hon Minister of Justice, Hon Minister of Education and dear Mayor of the District of Nyanza, we have tried and we will continue trying securing the necessary funds. But at this juncture, we would much appreciate if there is a specific advocacy from you for the Royal and Cultural City of Nyanza and on behalf of ILPD.

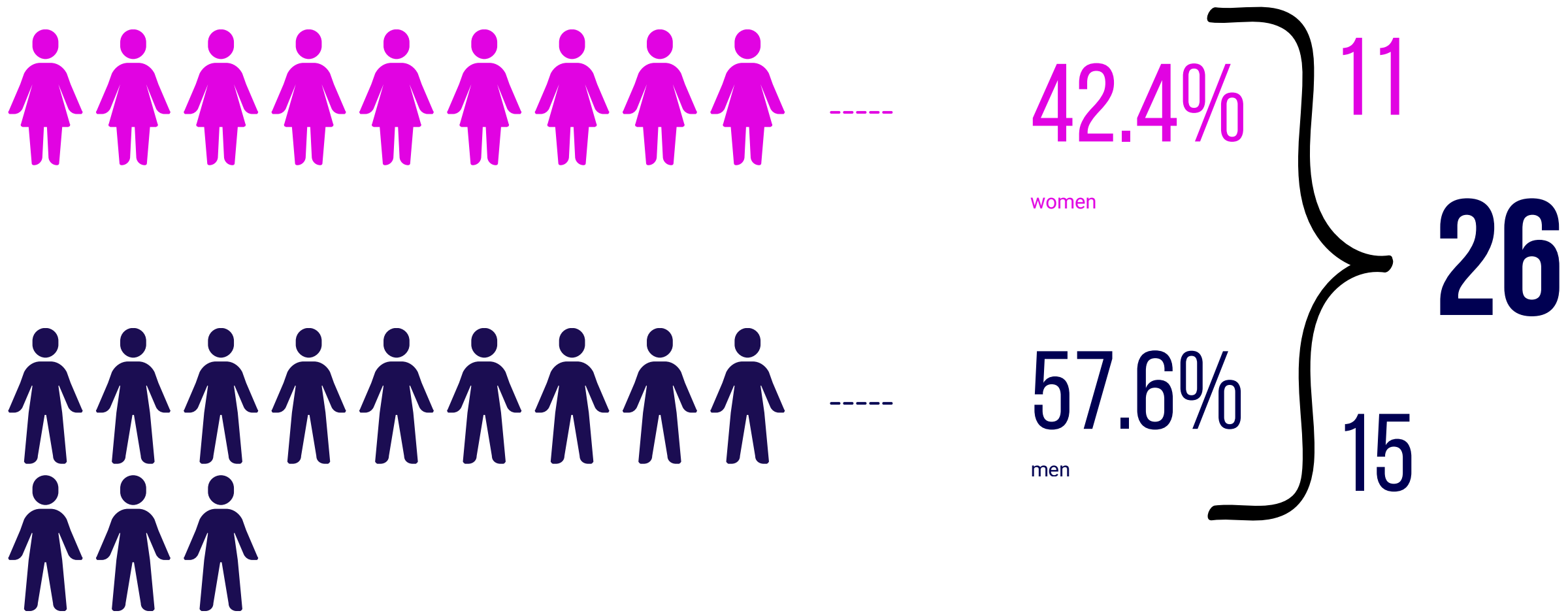

DIPLOMA IN CHILD JUSTICE



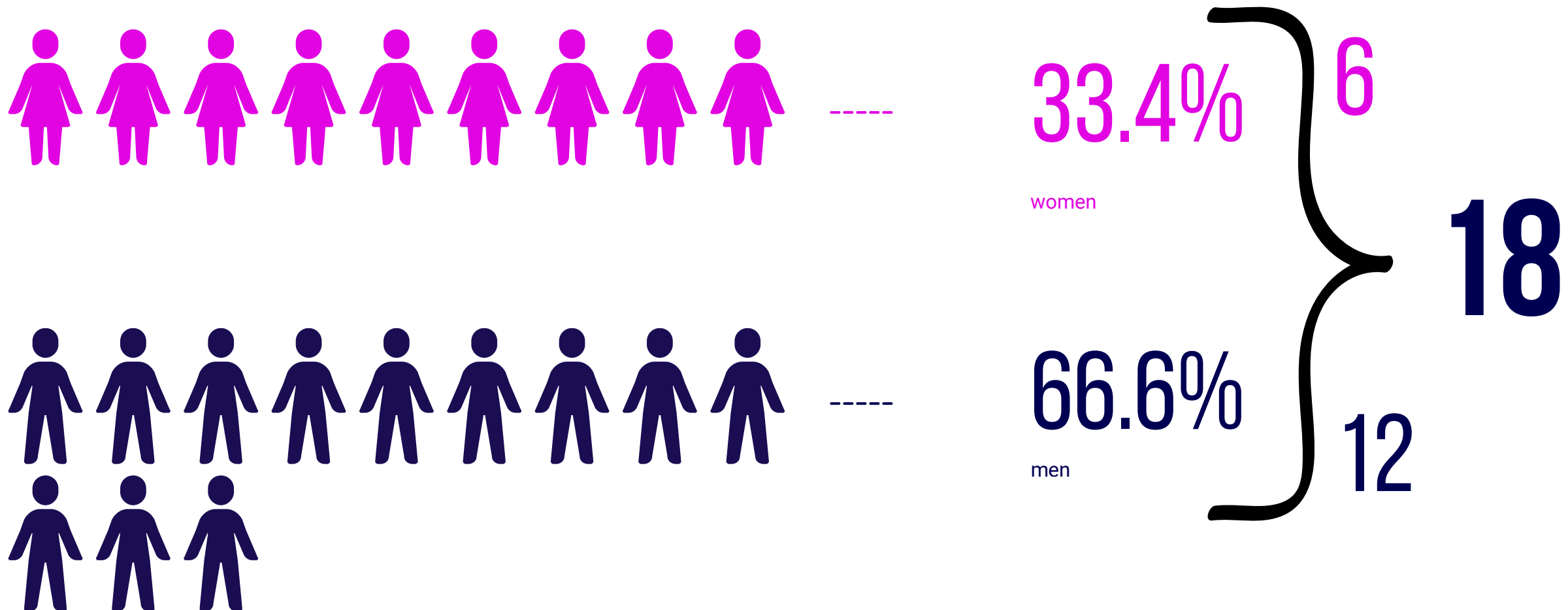

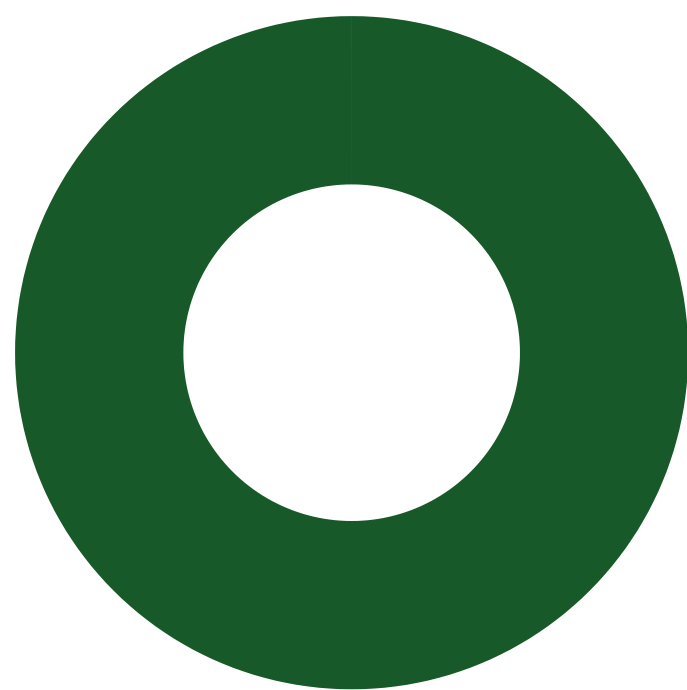
